



Statement of Purpose - Updates

Decision-Making

- Striving for Consensus on actions in Joint Platform
- Definition of consensus
- Each Agency & Organization will decide via its governance structure what it will implement
- Leadership Advisory Group will wrestle with challenging issues
- Leadership Advisory Group can rely on back-up voting (Approval = 2/3s of present members)

Regional Consistency Working Group

What are the necessary steps to ensure that Bay Area jurisdictions plan together toward shared regional outcomes?

- 1. What actions ensure that the projects and actions of greatest regional benefit will be prioritized, funded and implemented?
- 2. What actions address the potential negative impacts that adaptation actions (or inactions) might have around the Bay?
- 3. What actions promote multi-jurisdictional, multi-purpose adaptation solutions?

Local Planning Working Group

How can we support local adaptation planning in a way that is consistent and accessible to resource-constrained local jurisdictions?

- 1. What actions ensure that adaptation to rising sea levels is integrated into local jurisdictional plans?
- 2. What actions support the data, tools, training and staffing to develop local adaptation plans?
- 3. What actions support robust and equitable community engagement in shaping the development of local adaptation planning?

Project Implementation Working Group

How can we expedite the delivery of high-quality adaptation projects?

- 1. What actions or mechanisms evaluate and set priorities amongst competing shoreline projects?
- 2. What actions ensure that shoreline projects are delivered efficiently and quickly?
- 3. What actions support community engagement to ensure that community members are deeply involved?
- 4. What actions incentivize pilot projects that test new techniques and support learning and best practices?
- 5. How can we promote collective learning and track performance and risk reduction across the region?

Working Group Composition

- Two co-chairs
- 3-4 support staff
- 15-20 active members
- Representatives from LAG organizations/agencies
- Representatives from other orgs/agencies not on LAG but with appropriate expertise

- Expertise across themes
- Geographic diversity
- Scale diversity
- Experience/expertise in topic area

Bay Adapt Action

Outcome: What would be the desired outcome of the action? (Quantify to the extent possible as a target "success metric")

References and Models: Examples of similar actions

Brief Summary: 2-3 sentence description

Detailed Proposal (~1 page) that addresses:

- Administration: Who would be responsible for leading the action? What other supporting responsible parties and/or stakeholders would be necessary to ensure that the action can be implemented?
- Resources: What resources would be required?
 What are potential funding sources?
- Legal/Legislative: What legal changes would be required?
- Timing: When would the action occur?
- Unlocking Steps: What preliminary actions would have to occur to make this action feasible?

- Chairs will "crosswalk" across Working Groups to align similar ideas
- Chairs will present to LAG for feedback
- Staff support will conduct analysis, research, and support development of Action documents
